The field of health care is divided into many distinct yet interrelated sectors. Some of the core areas include medical and dental practice, health care equipment and services, pharmaceuticals, biotechnology, insurance, law and life sciences. Each of these broad areas represents a vast industry, with many sub-sectors that employ a diverse range of professionals who work on interdisciplinary teams to provide the people of the United States with the full spectrum of health care services.

Health care accounts for roughly 17 percent of the entire U.S. economy. The journal Health Affairs estimates the combined spending on health care in 2013 by households, businesses and the government to be \$2.9 trillion. According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, since the Affordable Care Act was signed into law in March 2010, the health care industry has gained more than 1 million new jobs. Today, there are more than 100 million people in the U.S. who are covered by the government-run Medicare and Medicaid services. And in the health care industry, the demand for services and innovation continue to grow in response to recent regulations and an ever-growing (and aging) population.

The U.S. health care system is governed and regulated by a complex assortment of laws and policies that can often seem overwhelming or confusing for the millions of patients and professionals who rely on health services or work in the interconnected sectors that comprise the health care field. It has been this way since the mid-1960s when the U.S. government first addressed the concept of social medicine; and each subsequent year seems to bring with it more complexities to account for. **The fact is, understanding, navigating, remaining in compliance with and effectively utilizing health law and policy can be a challenge even for the most experienced professional.**

Overview

The online Master of Arts in Health Law and Policy and online Master of Laws in Health Law and Policy have different audiences???? ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS INTERNATION APPLICANTS

- Candidates who have received their academic legal training from an institution outside the United States will need to either (1) register with the LL.M. Credential Assembly Service or (2) submit official law school transcripts and TOEFL reports directly to the Maurice A. Deane School of Law at Hofstra University. Candidates who choose not to register with LSAC's LL.M. Credential Assembly Service will need to make arrangements for one set of original transcripts printed in the school's native language and one set printed in English to be sent to and evaluated by the World Education Services credential evaluation service, www.wes.org. Applicants whose academic legal training was in a language other than English are required to present a recent score from the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) from the Educational Testing Service (ETS, www.ets.org or www.toefl.org). Hofstra Law's institution code is 2295.
